**III. SOURCE'S DESCRIPTION OF OBJECT**

1. SOURCE was standing in the back yard of her residence located at Palo Alto Drive, South San Antonio, Texas (GEOREF FRGQ 2323). On the 25th day of Nov. 1954 at 1805Z SOURCE was accompanied by her husband, [REDACTED] age 33, MRS [REDACTED] age 29, MR. [REDACTED] age 29, and three children who also sighted the object. Mrs. [REDACTED] attention was called to the moving object in the sky by her husband. SOURCE stated the object appeared to be approximately 1 mile away and moving at a very slow rate of speed. Object was brighter than the background of the sky and was about the size of a half dollar at arms length. Object first appeared to remain suspended and then moved from a direction of south to southeast in a straight and level flight. Reference Incl #1, Report 2D-UFOB-4B, SOURCE's sketch of sighting.

5. On the day of the observation, there was a clear sky. The weather was dry and there was a very slight breeze.

6. Kelly AFB, was notified by Mr. [redacted] husband of the source, and negative results were obtained.

7. Object did not change shape but did flicker occasionally.

8. SOURCE thought the object to be a balloon but indicated after a closer observation that it was not similar to any known object such as an aircraft.

**IV. INVESTIGATOR'S SUMMARY:**

1. A check was made with the following agencies with the indicated results.

- a. Randolph AFB Weather Station: No weather balloons were released on 25/1800Z Nov 54. GEOREF of Randolph AFB - FHGQ 4347
- b. Randolph AFB Air Traffic Section; Negative results.
- c. Kelly AFB MATS Air Traffic and Weather Section: Negative results.
- d. San Antonio Municipal Airport Weather Station(GEOREF FHGQ 3032): Negative results.
- e. Kelly AFB Operations and Air Traffic Section (GEOREF FHGQ 2822): On 25/1750Z Nov 54 a H-13 Helicopter #7956 departed from Ft. Sam Houston for Kelly AFB, Texas. The H-13's ETA was 25/1805Z Nov 54, but the ATA was 25/1820Z Nov 54. Fort Sam Houston is an Army Base located in the North East section of San Antonio, Texas. Name of the pilot flying the helicopter was 1/Lt Robert Bowlen. Reference Incl#2, Rept 2D-UFOB-4 for Flight Path of H-13 Helicopter
- f. An additional contact with Kelly AFB Operations and Air Traffic Section revealed the following aircraft were in the vicinity:

The surface winds from 0 to 6,000 feet were from 240° at 10 Knots indicating that the direction of traffic at Kelly AFB, Texas would be Southwesterly.

Helicopters fly a normal aircraft traffic pattern at Kelly AFB, so it is quite possible that the helicopter flew over the residence either killing time or entering traffic. The time of the sighting and the time the helicopter was aloft are approximately the same. The fact that Mrs. [redacted] stated that the object remained suspended for some length of time also gives the investigator a clue that it was probably a helicopter. SOURCE stated that the object was flying into the sun part of the time, and therefore, the object could have been quite deceiving. The bubble of the H-13 helicopter is quite large, and therefore it is possible that the SOURCE saw the helicopter when the sun was reflecting off the canopy. 


