

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

1. Telephone conversation between A/1C DeRudder, Headquarters, 4602d AISS, and M/Sgt G. Leman, Flight 3-A, 4602d AISS.
2. The undersigned called Flight 3-A with reference to a follow-up UFOB investigation of objects sighted at Green Bay, Wisconsin, 25/0750Z Aug 55. It was suggested that Flight 3-A contact the observer and question him as to the description of the sighting, the acquisition of purported physical evidence, and to ascertain the reliability of the observer if possible. Travel to the scene of the sighting was left to the discretion of the Investigating Officer after making the above telephone call to the observer.
3. Acquisition of the physical evidence was stressed to Flight 3-A.

1. This is an actual verbatim report received by this Squadron from the Green Bay Filter Center.
2. In accordance with AFR 200-2, Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOB), dated 12 Aug 54. This letter is submitted for your information and necessary action:
 - a. Two (2) balloon shaped objects observed, appeared to be fifty (50) feet in length, and thirty (30) feet round. Also approximately twenty (20) small planes observed about the size of a P-40, had a bulb on underside of plane.
 - b. Also two (2) small coptors seen. Seemed to be about five (5) feet in height. Had two (2) single rotors and rotors had fins on them that appeared to be some sort of shearing edge. They seemed to be transparent - light whitish color.
 - c. Two (2) flying saucers also observed seemed to shoot red streaks out holes in rear of saucer. There seemed to be no definite formation. There was a sort of whispering sound.
 - d. Red streaks drew the attention of observer to the sighting. First detection seemed to be at approximately 30,000 feet - they were circling and descending. At time of disappearance they were going all directions.
 - e. Observation of balloons and planes lasted about 30 seconds, but helicopters lasted longer. They seemed to land and disappear.
 - f. Saw chute come down into street with little man on it. Little man ran around behind house and disappeared. Observer followed and saw the man run to another coptor landed in back of house.

g. Coptor attempted to take off but collapsed. Two (2) small men jumped out and apparently the coptor was light because men picked it up and carried it off into the dark with them. They were lost in the darkness by sighter.

h. This A.M. a small barefoot print was seen and also a small shoe print that appeared to have two (2) heels on it.

i. Just before day break reddish bubbles (air bubbles) were seen coming down. He touched one and poof - like a soap bubble.

j. Was investigated by local police - all they could see were stars through broken clouds.

k. At 0830Z (after the chute incident) two (2) detectives were sent to the home of the observer. They stated the fellow seemed to be sober and sane, although he has been sick the past two (2) days. Detectives have no knowledge of what he is being treated for.


l. Wife was asked, but she was uncertain of observation and had little to say.

m. Weather at the time of sighting - Hazy - but high ceiling - Night Visibility - good - Cloud Cover - thin.




III. SOURCE'S DESCRIPTION OF SIGHTING: Source was outside of his residence, [REDACTED], Green Bay, Wisconsin, at 250750Z August 1955, when he saw a helicopter four (4) to five (5) feet high, with three (3) foot rotors. The helicopter landed 100 to 150 feet from him and he saw something run from the aircraft which looked like a little man or dog. He then ran after the aircraft, which took-off, and then he tried to chase the little man or dog, and while doing so stumbled over some material that looked like pieces of pottery. Source does not believe that the material fell off of the UFOB, but thinks that it is part of a casserole cover. Source has possession of the pottery.

Source also sighted a small transparent parachute land 100 to 150 feet from him and something a foot high, that looked like a little man run away from the parachute. Source then ran to the parachute but it had disappeared, and he could not find any trace of the parachute, or the foot high man that ran from it.

Source also saw four (4) more of the parachutes which took on an appearance of bubbles, and then disappeared.

The next night the source also sighted what appeared to be a wing type aircraft, but he was not sure and said that it might have been a hawk.

Source also saw a glow in the sky about a month ago; then a circular object with a red glow, moving speedily north to south.

SUPPLEMENTARY INVESTIGATIVE EFFORTS:

1. Reference subject UFOB, the originating officer of TT MSG ANOPS-08-267, was contacted via TP and stated that the information had been received by telephone from the Filter Center at Green Bay, Wisconsin. The Operations Section of the 676th AC & W Sqdn did not personally contact the observer of the UFOB.

2. The Filter Center at Green Bay, Wisconsin, was contacted by TP, and information received from Sgt Wilson who states that he spoke to observer of the UFOB, but did not see the pottery in question. Sgt Wilson also stated that two policemen, and later two detectives were sent to the home of the observer of the UFOB, and the statement of the detectives is that the material looked like pieces of pottery from a casserole top, or cover. The detectives further stated that the individual had been under a doctors care for some time prior to the UFOB sighting; however, they could not learn the nature of the ailment. They said that individual appeared sober, but his face was flushed.

3. UFOB observer stated that he had been [REDACTED] and that he does not have any military service.

COMMENTS OF PREPARING OFFICER:

1. Due to fantasy of UFOB, and apparent fabrication on the part of the source, and the fact that on several other occasions source has claimed to have observed what appear to be phenomenal happenings, the reliability of the information is very doubtful.
2. The value of the physical evidence is not pertinent to this case in so far as the observer stated that he personally did not believe it fell off of, or was part of the UFOB. The pottery further appears to be part of a fabricated UFOB, in the hoax category.
