1. Indicated hereon is report of Flying unidentified objects observed by an Air Force pilot at this Base.

2. Information includes:

a. Location and time of sighting was at  $39^{\circ} 34'N$  -  $111^{\circ} 20'W$  (10 miles east of Mount Pleasant, Utah); 2013 hours Zebra, 21 July 1949.

b. Weather at the time was CAVU.

c. Name, occupation and address of reporter is: 2nd Lieutenant (pilot) [REDACTED] of the 1st Strategic Support Squadron, Biggs Air Force Base, Texas.

d. Photograph/s of objects not available.

e. Sketches of objects' configuration not tendered by reporter.

f. Object sighted:

- (1) Number - two (2).
- (2) Shape - indistinguishable.
- (3) Size - not tendered.
- (4) Color - silver or white.
- (5) Speed - indicated as excessive in comparison with aircraft.
- (6) Heading -  $337^{\circ}$  true.
- (7) Manueverability - not indicated.
- (8) Altitude - 9000 feet above sea level.

- (10) Exhaust trail - negative.


Subject: Report of Flying Discs

3. Narrative: As reported by Lieutenant [REDACTED] who was co-pilot for 1st Lieutenant [REDACTED], AO-16655, 1st Strategic Support Squadron, Biggs Air Force Base, Texas; flying from left seat of C-54, number 42-72691 enroute to this base from Spokane, Washington.

The unidentified objects were sighted by Lieutenant [REDACTED], only, who sighted the objects under the nose of the aircraft on a head-on approach curving slightly to their own left. The C-54 was at 11,000 feet altitude on a true heading of 157° with a ground speed of 156 knots. There was no fatigue among crew members.

Elapsed time of visual sighting was for a period of about three (3) seconds as the objects went under line of sight beneath the aircraft. Lieutenant [REDACTED] called out that he had sighted these objects; with immediate scanning by other crew members with negative results.
