a. Brief description of object:

Shape-Generally round with a hazy inverted truncated cone on top

Size-3 Feet diameter

Color-Blue white soft light

Number- 1

Aerodynamic Features-None observed

Trail or Exhaust- None observed

Propulsion system- None observed

Speed- Stationary to 110knts

Sound- None heard

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Maneuvers- Object first reported estimated 7000 ft about 10mils  
west of the Capitol Dome and stationary, it then moved SW for about  
8mils reducing altitude to about 1000 ft, then it moved NW for about  
10 miles still at 1000 ft, there it moved in a great arc SE changing to  
E to NE to N to NW which placed it a few miles SW of the center of  
Alexandria Va.

Manner of disappearance- Object disappeared while observers were  
changing fuel tanks.

- b. Time sighted- 2335Z to 2350Z
- c. Manner of observation-Visual, aircraft C-45 No 4359364 at 7,000 feet, 140 knots.
- d. Location of observer- 10 to 15 miles WSW of Capitol. Distance from object at sighting was about 15 to 18 miles, point of nearest approach was some 6,000 feet below. (see also (a) and (c))
- e. Identification on observers were Hersberger, Robert A. Capt., 13728A and Davis, Donald Stetson, Major, AC-742974, these Officers appear perfectly normal, rational and unexcitable, Officers are assigned to Headquarters USAF Bolling Air Force Base, Washington 25, D. C.
- f. Weather and wind conditions. Visibility unrestricted, winds at 7,000 feet, were from 330° at 48 knots. Temperature at this altitude-15°C.
- g. Any activity or condition, meteorological or otherwise. (None observed)
- h. Existence of any physical evidence. (None)
- i. Interception or identification action taken- One F-94B scrambled. This pilot did not sight object in question.
- j. Local aircraft airborne at the time for sighting. Aircraft inbound and out bound Bolling period 2330Z to 2400Z, Air Force 7688, pilot Artwohl, AF 6159 pilot Glassebrook, AF 8379, pilot Bone, AF 1475, pilot Pruitt, AF 5312, Payon.
