A. Sighting number one (1) made by Mr. [REDACTED] of Ripley, New York, Phone [REDACTED]

1. One object round in shape, approximately the size of a DC-3; Air speed 150-200 miles per hour. Object was a glowing light, white in color, no trail or exhaust was seen, no sound, level flight. Object disappeared over building and was lost from sight.

2. Sighting was made at 2400Z, 27 July 1952 and under observation for one minute.

3. Observation was visual from ground.

4. Observer located at Geo Ref LN 1616 - Object 3 1/2 miles south of observer at estimated 5,000 feet altitude.

5. Sighting made by qualified observer of the Ground Observer Corps.

6. Weather - 25,000 scattered clouds, winds aloft 20 knots from 270°.

7. Meteorological activity unknown.

8. No physical evidence available.

9. No intercept action taken.

10. No local air traffic.

B. Sighting number two (2) was made by Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED] of Ransomville, New York, Phone [REDACTED]. Object was sighted twice by these two observers, while on duty at Ground Observer Corps Post.

1. Object was one (1) in number and was triangular in shape and was a pale glowing red in color. No trail or exhaust was seen and no sound was heard. Speed very slow, no trail or exhaust was seen. Object faded from sight while going away from observers.

2. Sightings were made at 0130Z and 0200Z, 27 July 1952.

3. Observation was visual from the ground.

4. Observer located at Geo Ref MP 0515. Object was overhead and when first seen was traveling west to east. Second time seen it circled post and disappeared going south west.

5. One observer has private pilots license. Both observers are qualified observers with the Ground Observer Corps.
