





An unidentified object was observed visually at 0245 Pacific Daylight Time, 4 August 1952 for approximately one minute. It was described as round in shape and bluish in color, and it was approximately the size of an automobile headlight. It was traveling south at a high rate of speed at an estimated altitude of 3,000 feet. No audible sounds were reported.

The observers, Mary Barr, P.O. Box 363, Redding California and Alice Raycroft, 1819½ Sacramento Street, Redding, California were located at a G.O.C. Post at Red Bluff, California. The object appeared to be approximately 4 miles west of the post.

The weather officer reports the area as clear with visibility of 30 miles. Winds were 90° at 6 knots at 10,000 feet; at 20,000 feet winds were 210° at 30 knots.

Meteorological activity, physical evidence of the sightings and identification action taken were reported as negative.

One United Air Line DC-4 was in the area at the time of the sighting. This aircraft had been observed a short time before the object appeared.


