On the evening of October 31 at 7:40 PM  
while traveling <sup>North</sup> on highway #85 toward  
Atlanta some 4 miles from Fayetteville  
a strange object was seen flying overhead.

This strange object appeared to be  
flying at tree top level as I approached  
~~near~~ it. It was of orange color and  
very similar to an air blimp. I  
was traveling at a speed of 60-70  
miles per hour as I approached  
this object. It was coming directly  
over the road some 200 yards  
ahead so I immediately thought  
of falling aircraft and tried to  
stop before traveling beneath it.  
However, I went under the object  
which was moving very slowly across  
the ~~cross~~ road. As I passed under,  
the radio in the car was silenced  
by as if traveling over a bridge  
or under-pass. There was no  
static - just silenced until object was passed.

As I quickly got out of the car,  
the object seemed directly overhead  
at an estimated 500 feet. The  
length was estimated 4 times the  
height and width. (80' x 20' x 20')  
A clear bottom view, side view, and  
angle view was seen. After




lingering for about 20 seconds overhead the nose seemed to point in a  $45^{\circ}$  climb steadily increasing in speed and angle of climb until it disappeared slightly to the left of the moon and in an easterly direction. The speed was tremendous and completely disappeared in approximately 40 seconds.

There were no sparks nor was there any sound. The night was very clear and stars and moon very bright. There were no light beams visible and I looked all around.

This object was very dull orange near the center line and was brighter near the outer border edges.

As the object passed between the view of moon, and my location, on the upward climb, the color seemed to blend in with that of the moon, but was still visible.

Two remarkable falls of angel hair were reported in France on October 17 and 27, 1952. In both incidents, witnesses observed in the sky a strangely shaped, cottony cloud at a height of several thousand feet. Above it was a long, narrow, cylindrical object trailed by a white plume, moving slowly across the sky and accompanied by twenty or thirty smaller objects that looked like puffs of smoke. Following a broken path, they made rapid zigzag motions, and left a broad ribbon of white substance that slowly drifted to the ground and clung to trees, telephone wires, and roofs of houses. These masses of white threads were described as like wool, nylon, or Fiberglas. When rolled into a ball they became gelatinous and disappeared within a few hours; set on fire, they burned like cellophane.

To French entomologists, the angel hair seen in October 1952, was no mystery at all. The objects dancing the strange ballet were not spaceships, but spiders. Far from performing a mysterious experiment, they were merely carrying out the well-established routine of migration.

Each year the young spiders of most species leave the nests of their infancy and prepare to establish their own homes. Crawling by the hundreds or the thousands to the tops of fence posts, walls, or trees, they spin long silken webs which, inflated by the air, carry the tiny emigrants up from the ground. These gossamer parachutes drift up and along on rising air currents, sometimes to great heights; they may soar for a few yards or for many miles over hills and valleys. These migrating balloonists have been observed as high as 14,000 feet, and at sea 200 miles from any land. Eventually drifting back to earth, the spiders detach the now useless parachutes and move off to build new nests for the coming year, while the abandoned gossamer may pile up in great masses on trees, fences, telephone wires, and ground, to decay and vanish in a matter of hours. These gossamer showers sometimes include so many outworn webs that the filmy blankets of fine silk may be several inches deep and may cover an entire landscape like snow.

These migrations occur in spring or, more frequently, in autumn—but only when the weather is exactly right. Spiders may sit patiently for days, waiting for a calm, clear, windless day. On such days the steady upward currents of air from the sun-warmed ground carry the spiders gently aloft [7]. The association of angel hair with UFO sightings is completely natural. The drifting patches of gossamer reflect the sun brilliantly. A whole armada of saucers can appear simultaneously overhead and then vanish as the gossamer cascades to earth.

The description of the material and the date of the fall both indicate that the angel hair observed in France in October 1952 was of arachnid origin. Even the weather was exactly right—"superb, with a sky of cloudless blue"—for the migration of a smother of spiders.

Second Officer G. R. Roberts of the American S. S. *Adabelle Lykes* reports that on October 17, 1952, at 1010 G. M. T., in lat.  $28^{\circ}20'$  N., lon.  $90^{\circ}32'$  W., a brilliant light-green meteor was observed bearing  $335^{\circ}$  at an approximate altitude of  $30^{\circ}$ . So intense was the initial flash that the meteor illuminated the entire northwest horizon and as it descended pieces were observed falling from it which "resembled burning gasoline being thrown from a barrel." This phenomenon, which was of 5 seconds' duration, disappeared bearing north at approximately  $8^{\circ}$  altitude.

Third Officer Frank Kaminski, of the American S. S. *Atlantic Seaman*, Capt. Martin E. Dahl, Master, reports that while en route to Port Said at 1955 G. M. T., October 18, 1952, in lat.  $35^{\circ}57'$  N., lon.  $15^{\circ}48'$  E., he observed a comet-like streak which appeared in the north at an altitude of  $35^{\circ}$ , which moved in a westward and downward direction for about 2 or 3 seconds when at a bearing of  $345^{\circ}$  it exploded with a blinding flash which illuminated the entire area for about a second. A trail was visible in the path of the object to where it exploded, then curved upward and back to the eastward in a hook-shaped formation of rust-colored smoke. This trail was visible for at least 10 minutes before it disappeared completely.

A similar observation was made by Mr. Kaminski on the night of November 16 in South Suez Bay, but was bright orange in color and cigar shaped. It was headed southward at an altitude of  $15^{\circ}$  and was visible about 5 seconds.

large meteor, bright green in color with a long tail. It appeared  
near the star *Castor* at an approximate altitude of  $30^{\circ}$ . It trav-  
eled straight downward to the sea and was visible about 4 seconds.  
Weather cloudy, good visibility, sea calm, barometer 30.30 inches,  
air temperature  $72^{\circ}$  F.

Chief Officer Gerald F. Burgess of the Canadian S. S. *Rincon Hills*, Capt. E. A. Mallock, Master, reports that at 0015 G. M. T., October 28, 1952, in lat.  $12^{\circ}30'$  N., lon.  $64^{\circ}53'$  W., he observed a meteor originating very close to the star *Acrux* altitude  $24^{\circ}$  bearing  $178^{\circ}$ . It was not traveling as fast as the usual meteor but was twice the size of *Venus* when setting and had a tail giving off a very brilliant greenish light. The direction of travel was  $240^{\circ}$ , and it was still visible when less than  $5^{\circ}$  above the horizon. When passing behind clouds it gave the effect of lightning, although there was no lightning at the time.

Weather partly cloudy, wind NE. force 4, air temperature  $84^{\circ}$  F.

1. Transmitted herewith, in accordance with AFL 200-5, dated 29 April 1952, are the compiled reports of the Imperial Iranian Army relative to unidentified flying objects in Iran. Inclosures 1, 3, 4, and 5 are the Persian language documents, and Inclosures 6, 7, 8, and 9 are this office's translation of the Persian documents. Inclosure 2 is an Iranian Army translation to English of what was apparently a table for the compilation of the various reports.

2. For the most part, these reports are discounted by the Ass't. Chief of Staff, G-2, Iranian Army; he feels that the observers are incompetent and their reports probably exaggerated. In spite of this they all have common characteristics, which he can not explain. He does feel, however, that most of the objects could be explained as meteorological balloons, jet aircraft, or meteors, any of which would stimulate the uneducated observer to build up a story about what he saw.

3. Insofar as possible, this office is complying with the directives of AFL 200-5. Paragraph seven directs separate reports for single incidents which is impractical in this particular case.

Translation of Incl No. 1

From G-2, 5th Branch to Chief of Staff, Army, subject: Extract from Reports Received Relative to Luminous Objects Sighted in Iran; Foreign Investigations and Opinions.

1. American Air Force Investigations of Flying Saucers. It has been three years that in the States of the U.S. flying objects of many different types (cigar - spherical objects like saucers) have been seen. These were single or in groups, moved very fast, with movement similar to that of a twisting snake, and had no sound. They would suddenly turn in direction 90 or 130 degrees. Experts and offices allied to this subject have various opinions. A portion maintains that these things are not made by human hands, but were reflected light or mirages, but other groups do not accept this theory.

At any rate, studies continue so that it will be clear what these things are.

2. Investigations of the English Government. The English government with many investigations has found that these things are not figments of the imagination, that they are some sort of air weapon and are manufactured in communist countries, perhaps in Russia. Because of this an office for the investigation of these flying saucers was opened: the office is composed of a group of scientists, pilots, and photographers. This office has been under the Air Ministry, with a general officer as head. From the studies it became evident that these saucers move from east to west. From the start, air and sea maneuvers of the western powers have sighted each day several flyings.

3. In Iran. There have been 13 reports of luminous objects, 11 of which are connected to the boundary of Russia (various parts of which are attached.) (Translator's note: Referring probably to a map which was attached to original report.) The other two are from Kazerun (29°38'N 51°33'E) and Seravan (thought to be on the border of Baluchistan). The luminous objects are in various opinions spherical, rockets, or saucers, and all are luminous and were seen to have great speed. The sighting of some of these was not longer than a few seconds and three reports stated that they made a terrible noise.

G-2 Report: It is probable that in Iran these are explicable things which were not understood; in spite of that, the following points are made:

1. It is possible that these sightings have been atomic weapons fired from Russian territory - such as 1, 4, 5, and 7. (Probably referring to Incl No. 2.)
2. Probable astronomical bodies.
3. Probable optical illusions.
4. These things were various bodies.
5. Perhaps machines for photography or the completion of atmospheric studies.

Office of Chief of Frontier Guard Report.

I beg to respectfully state as the follow-up to Report 3500 submitted on 31/6/25, the available information about luminous bodies from the concerned frontier post, myself, and most of the captured people. Information received was sent as Report No. 3369, 31/6/8, Code 335-31/6/29 and the following explanation is submitted.

1. First kind: Of circular shape with a diameter of approximately 1/2 metre. It stopped in the air at one spot (at an indeterminable distance), under which a large zone was lighted like day, and objects and persons were shown larger even than they are in reality. This big, luminous body has been seen both in red and white, and nobody has been able to determine anything about the spot of origination or the launching machine.

2. Another kind is the kind that is distributed from the ground. It is very strong and lights the air like day and can be seen at night in a dark sky, leaving a visible course like a thick tube behind.

3. It is the opinion of most that one kind of these luminous bodies is for finding aircraft in the sky (translator's note: probably means a ground to air missile) and another kind is for lighting the ground and illuminating targets. One of the captured by the name of [REDACTED], who fully gave information to the frontier guards about the luminous bodies he had personally seen in Barshabad, Russia, opined the following:

One kind of light was like a projector (searchlight) which was very powerful and which illuminated sometimes from above to below and sometimes from below to above. At these times there were aircraft in the sky and they could be completely seen as though it were day. Sometimes this light was thrown horizontally and sometimes diagonally or perpendicularly. It was very strong and split the clouds. One time five of us (Kourak) were in a courtyard which measured 40 by 28 and it became lighted like day. Later that circle was about 60 cm. It was completely without noise. Although lighted from starting to stopping point, it left only a very dim trail which could be seen. It was approximately 3 kilometers from the ground and its altitude was more than that of the highest airplane.

Another kind was both red and white colored. This kind was stronger than the first type but its duration was less and lasted no longer than 20 or 30 seconds. While this was lighted we five (Kourak) friends in the courtyard saw each other taller than reality and other objects under the light appeared larger than reality.

Another kind whose color was green or white or red, was seen. When they dropped it (translator's note: hung it or loosed it) it went very high vertically, or when loosed horizontally. Sometimes it appeared as a vertical circle and again as a horizontal circle when dropped (or released). The duration of these was approximately 2 or 3 minutes and the brightness of the light was less than that of the first two types. The diameter of the beam in trail was approximately 10 cm. When traveling in the air it seemed like small planets which scattered into pieces the size of fingernails. It left smoke in its course; the line of smoke was evident but soon dissipated.
