FOR INTEL PP FLY OBJ RPT. UNIDENTIFIED FLY OBJ SIGHTED SIDI SLIMANE AB (34 DEGREE 16 MIN N 5 DEGREE 66 MIN W (2 SEPT CURR AT 2114 HRS BY CREW OF USAF C-47 ON ROUT TNG FLT. CREW OBSR UNUSUALLY BRIGHT WHITE LIGHT WHICH APPEARED LARGER THAN ORDINARY AIRCRAFT NAV LIGHT. SHAPE OF OBJ COULD NOT BE DETERMINED AND NO SOUND WAS AUDIBLE. PARA OBJ FIRST SIGHTED BY CP AT 2114 HRS WHICH WAS CALLED TO ATTN OF PLT. LIGHT FIRST OBSR AT EST ALT OF ABOUT 4000 FEET ABOVE C-47. OBJ RATE OF CLOSURE VMRYFAST AND FOL NEAR COLLISION COURSE IN RELATION TO C-47. APPROACHING OBJ WHEN LEVEL WITH C-47 EXECUTED 180 DEGREE DESCENDING TURN AT UNEST HIGH SPEED. DURING SECOND 180 DEGREE TURN. OBJ DESCENDED TO 700 FEET OR BELOW. WHILE DESCENDING. OBJ DEFINITELY DECREASED IN SPEED. C-47 AIRCRAFT SPEED 140 MPH ATYDN ALT OF 6000 FEET. NEAREST PT THAT OBJ WAS OBSR WAS BETWEEN ONE QUARTER AND ONE HALF MILE DIS. WHILE MAX DIS OF OBSERVATION WAS APRX 3 MILES. VISIBILITY DURING SIGHTING 20 MILES PLUS. SKY WAS CLEAR WITH NO MOON. WINDS CALM. PARA CON TWR CONTACTED WHEN OBJ FIRST SIGHTED AND REPT NO ACFT VICINITY OF SIDI SLIMANE. 

1. An unidentified flying object was sighted at Sidi Slimane Air Base (34°16'N 05°56'W), 2 September 1953, at 2114 hours by the crew of a USAF C-47 on a routine training flight. The crew observed an unusually bright white light which appeared to be larger than an ordinary aircraft navigation light. Shape of the object could not be determined and no sound was audible.

2. The object was first sighted by the co-pilot at 2114 hours which was called to the attention of the pilot. The light was first observed at an estimated altitude of about 4,000 feet above the C-47. The object's rate of closure was very fast and followed a near collision course in relation to the C-47. The approaching object, when level with the C-47, executed a 180° descending turn at an unestimated high speed. During the second 180° turn, the object descended to 700 feet or below. While descending, the object definitely decreased in speed, then made a 90° turn toward the main highway that parallels Sidi Slimane Air Base at which point it appeared stationary. The light then disappeared.

3. The observers flew the C-47 in a 360° circle in order to continue observation of the object. The light could be sighted at all times by the observers and was seen for approximately three minutes. The C-47's speed was 140 mph at an altitude of 6,000 feet. The nearest point at which the object was observed was between one-quarter and one-half mile distance, while maximum distance of observation was approximately eight miles. Visibility during sighting was 20 miles plus. The sky was clear with no moon. Winds were calm.

4. Sidi Slimane Control Tower was contacted when the object was first sighted and reported no aircraft in the vicinity.

COMMENTS:

1. Air Traffic Control at Casablanca, French Morocco, was contacted and reported no aircraft in the area except two naval aircraft in the vicinity of Port Lyautey, approximately 25 miles from Sidi Slimane Air Base. The air crew of the C-47 previously observed the naval aircraft on their flight to Sidi Slimane Air Base.

2. The 549th AGWC Group was inoperative during reported sighting of unidentified object. The previously unconfirmed report from the Naval Station at Port Lyautey, French Morocco, cited in TML, DIOC 1061, is now definitely established as an erroneous report. The Naval Station at Port Lyautey further reported radar inoperative during reported sighting of unidentified object.


