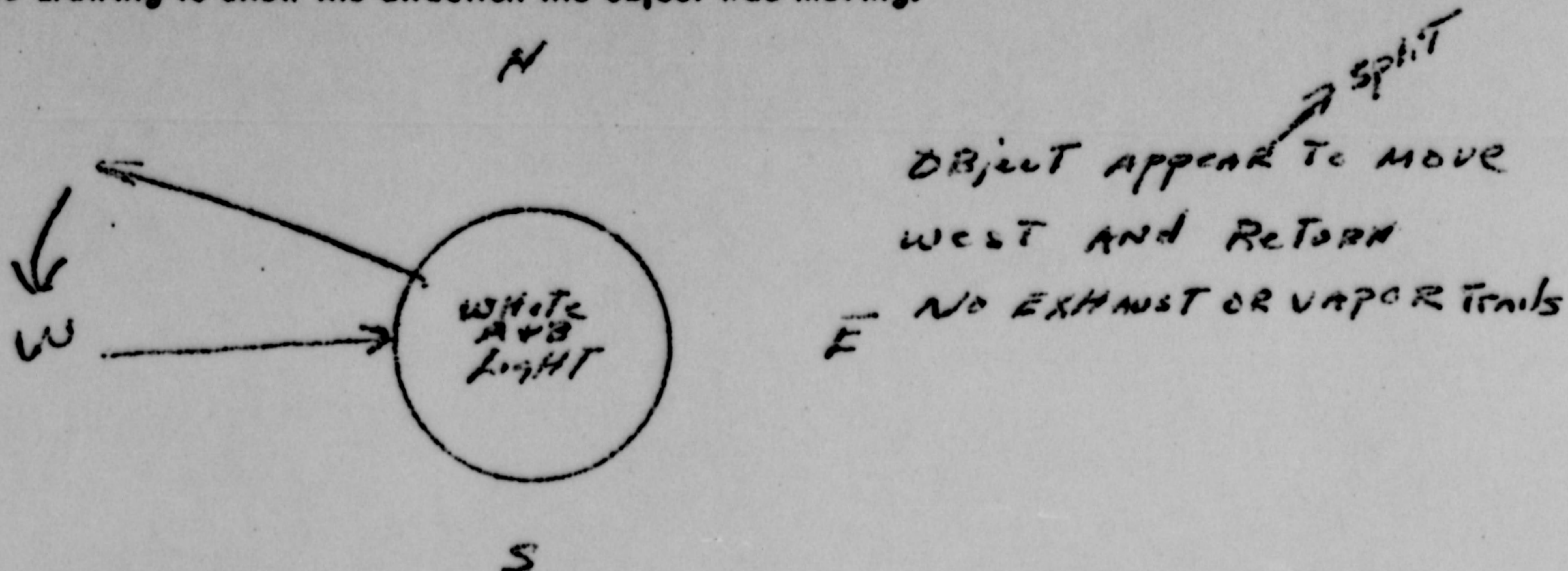

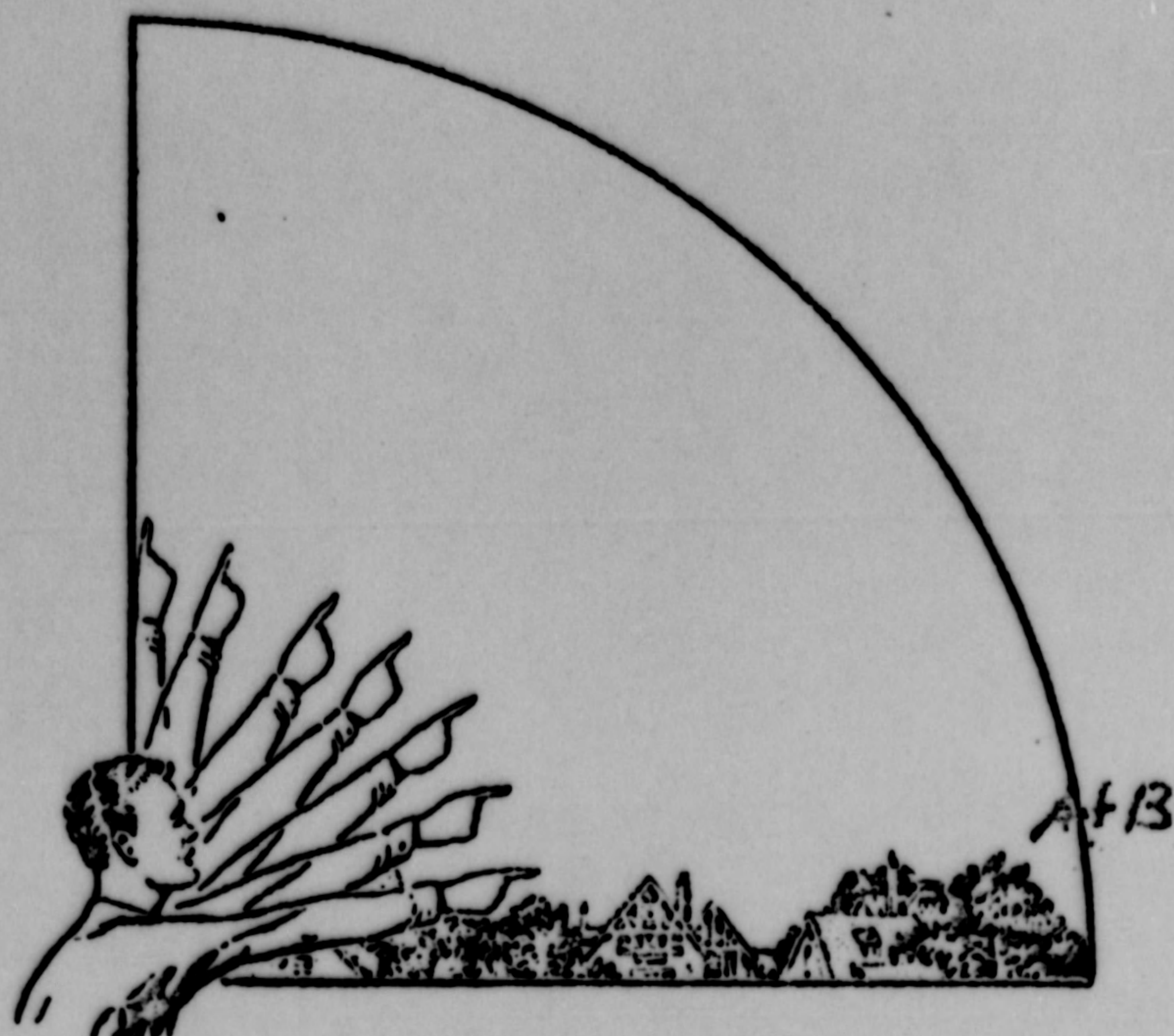

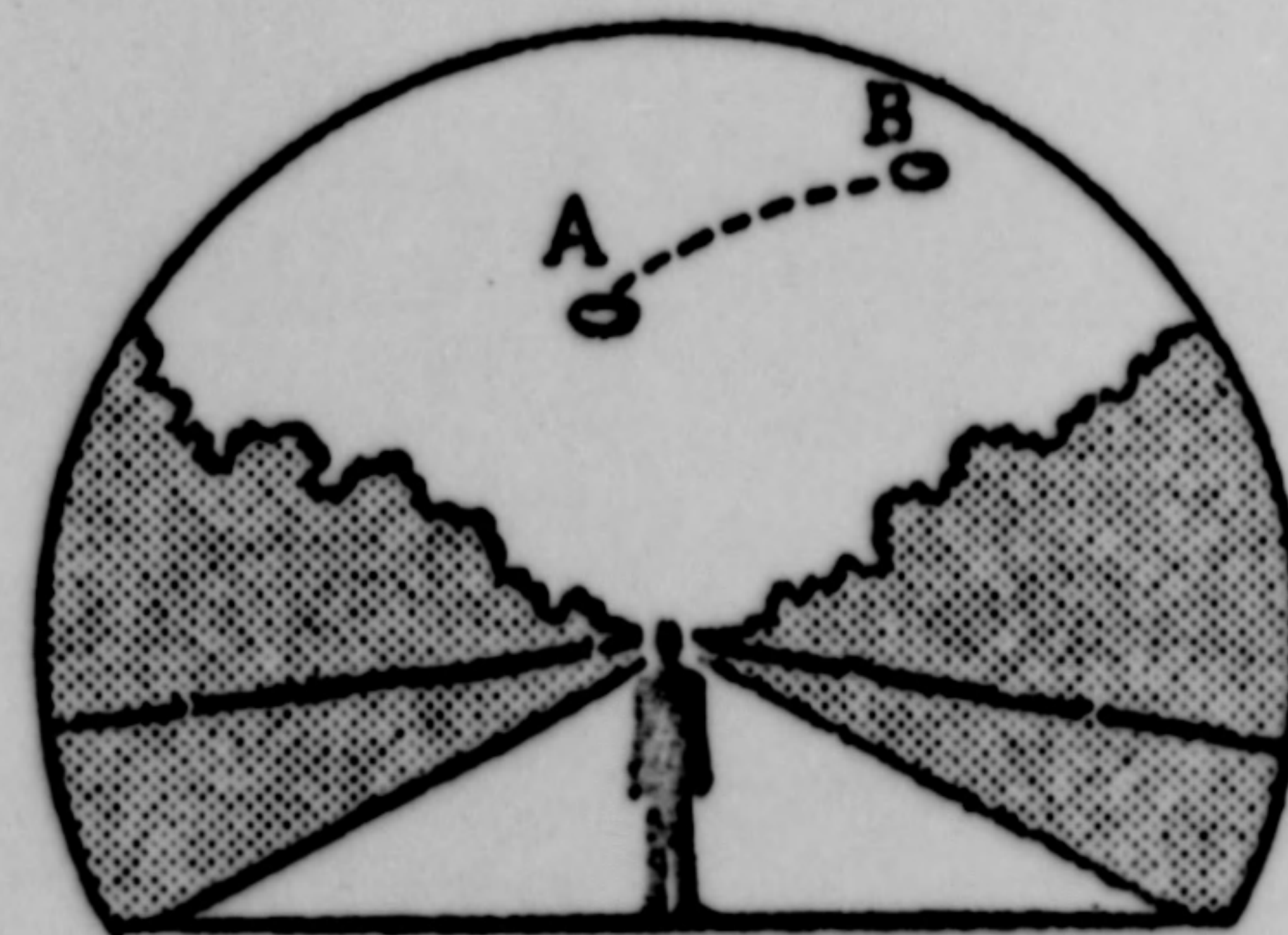

I first noticed the object at 2235 hours on 13 Oct 53. It appeared to be approximately six miles north of the Control Tower. The light appeared to be unpowered and circular in shape, also the light appeared to cast off a light and proceed west and return to the stationary unpowered light. Then at times the light appeared to drop directly to the ground, this happened several times during the night.

The object never appeared to have wings or give off exhaust or vapor trails.

On Oct. 14, J. [redacted] and friend, atop Mt. Adams of Cincinnati witnessed a "solid blue" ellipsoid, "like a football" zip noiselessly overhead. He estimated the object's elevation to be slightly over Cincinnati's tallest building, the Carew Tower, whose base was 800 ft. below. In November two luminous discs flying tight formation were sighted by [redacted] over Mt. Carmel
