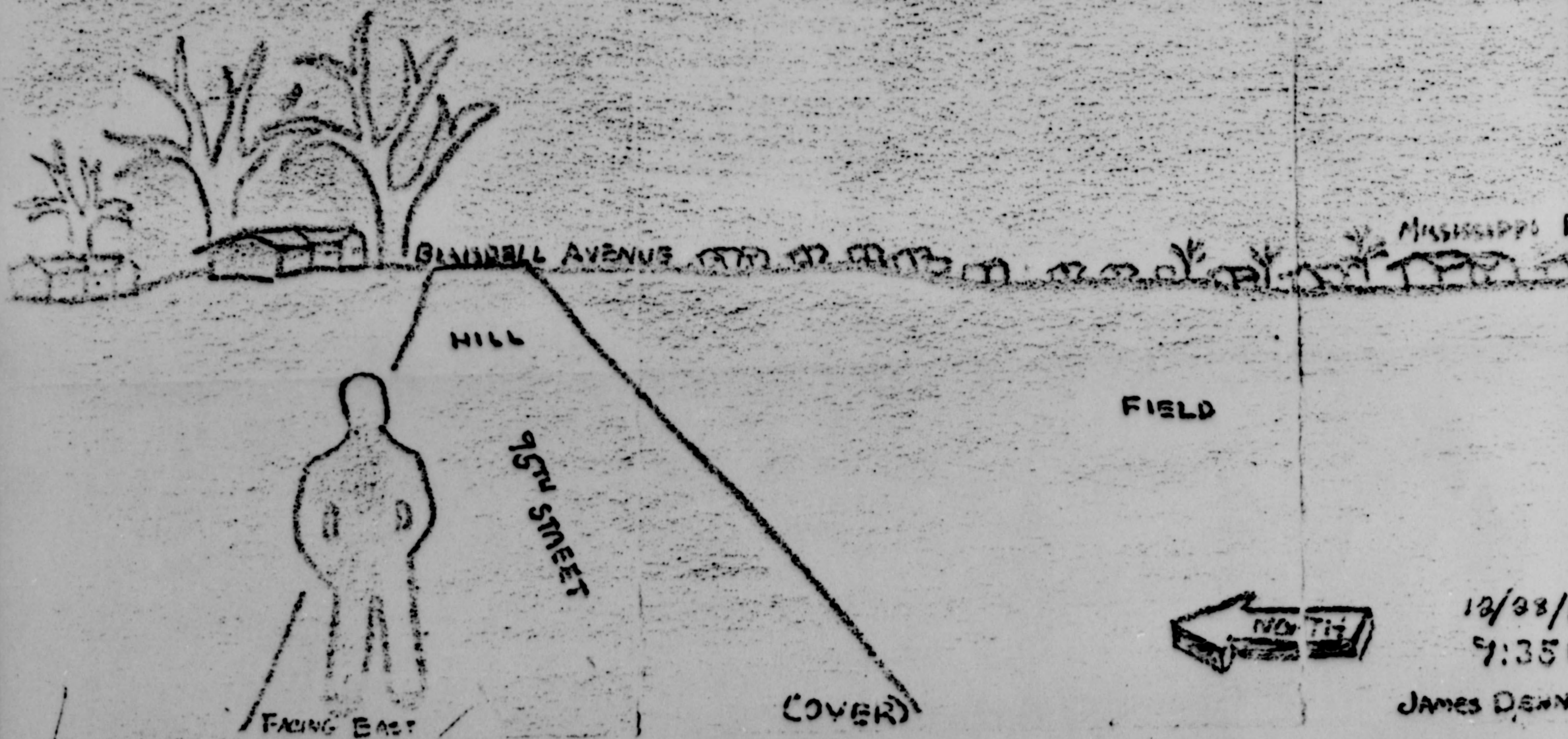

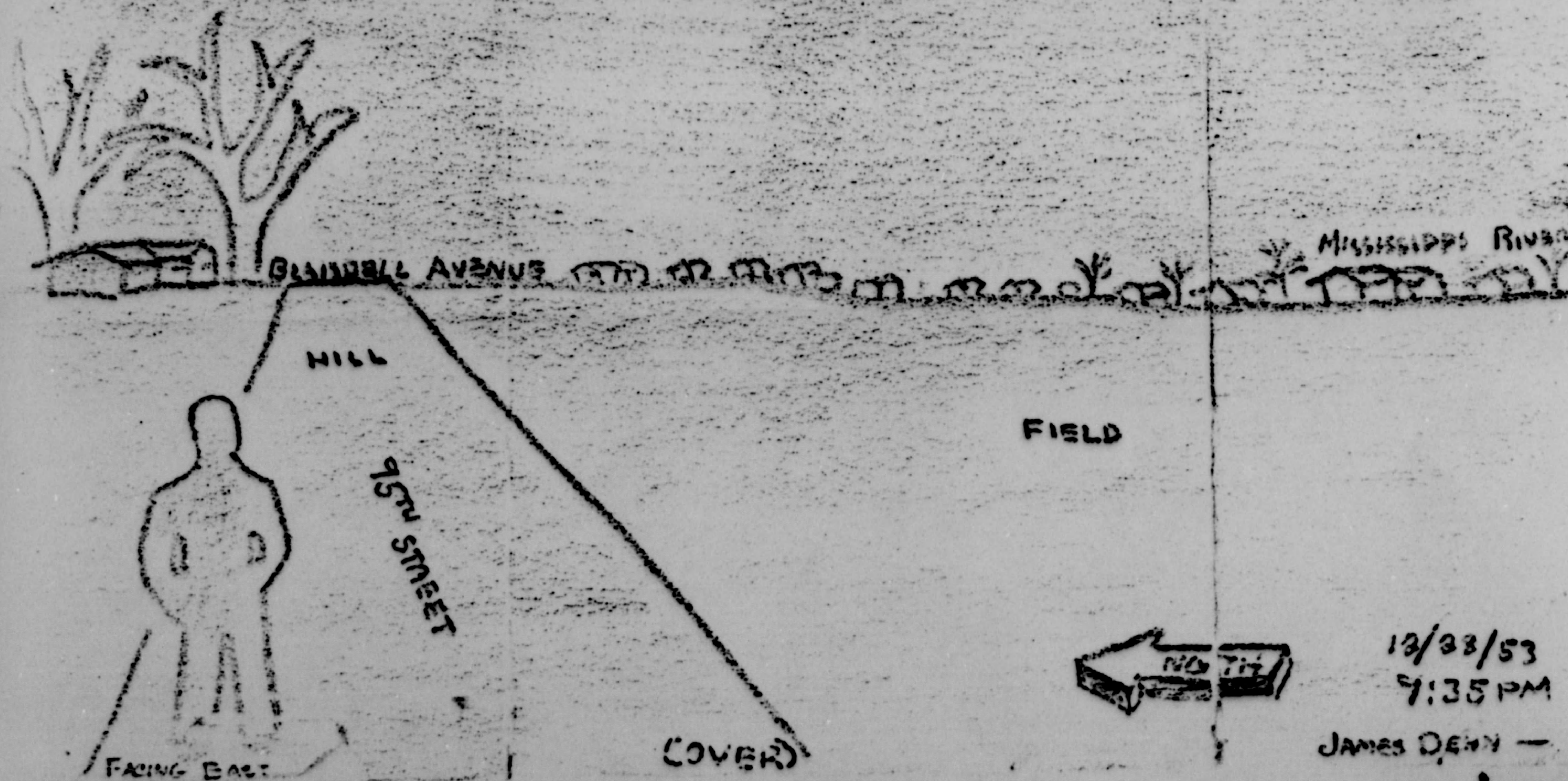

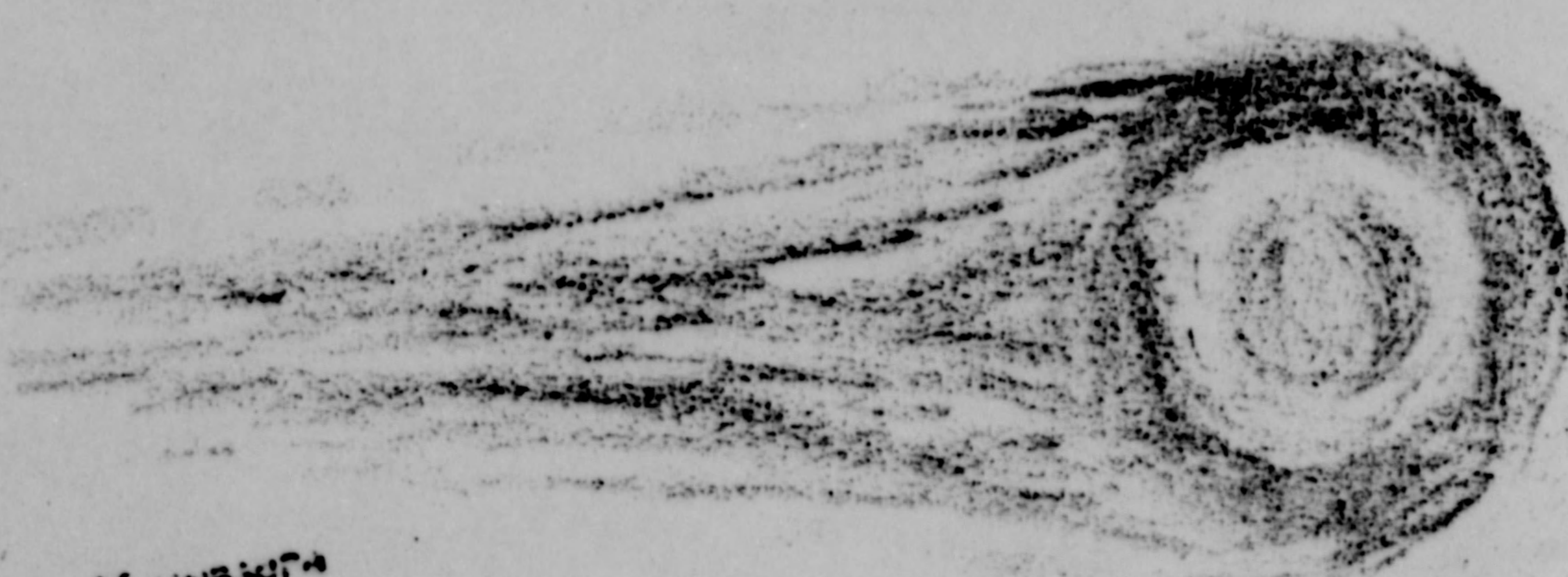
NOTE - THE OBJECT REMAINED IN LEVEL FLIGHT.
