



Dear Sir:

A few months ago, and after fifty years of life, I suddenly saw two "flying saucers" within a month. I am enclosing my description of these strange "things" after seeing your address in the paper, together with your avowed desire to run these reports to earth.

It was midnite on a cloudy nite, and I was riding in the caboose of my freight train, when suddenly I saw the first one appear and veer sharply to the left, and after about five or ten seconds, disappear. I saw it edgewise and sidewise, and it was colored brilliantly with green, yellow and blue bands like rainbow hues all around it. It left no tail. Here is my drawing of it, the best I could tell:



The second was seen in daylite, about a half hour before sunset, and in the south of me, so I had a very good view. Both of these "things" were about one or two hundred feet from the ground, and not very large. I would say about five feet in diameter or more. The second one was just above the house tops about half a mile away. It was round and brightly colored, and had a blunt tail. It travelled horizontally with the earth, as did the other, and after travelling a few seconds, a second ball, pure white, "exploded" out of the first ball, without disturbing the makeup of the first, and after travelling a few seconds, both just vanished. Here is my picture of this one:



My opinion? Neither of these were man made. They were probably electrical displays of some kind, one of natures pranks. I do not know of course, but I submit it to you for what it might be worth. Both travelled rapidly, and fairly close to the ground, and to me.

It seems strange that I should see two of them so close together, inasmuch I never saw anything unusual all the other fifty years of my life. I hope This information will be of some use to you, but I doubt it.
