PILOT [REDACTED] IS A NATIONAL GUARD F86 PILOT AND FELT OBJECT IMPORTANT ENOUGH TO HAVE AN F86 SCRAMBLE MADE FROM VAN NUYS TO TRY AND INTERCEPT OBJECT. AF286 B25 TEST PILOTS ENGLERT AND PETERSON FLYING IN A MAINTENANCE TEST HOP FOR HUGHES ACFT CORP. AT APPROXIMATELY 1115PDT BOTH PILOTS ALMOST SIMULTANEOUSLY SIGHTED A STRANGE OBJECT WHILE FLYING AN EAST SOUTHEAST HEADING APPROXIMATELY 15 MILES SE FROM LOS ANGELES. OBJECT LOOKED LIKE A PENCIL THIN LINE IN HORIZONTAL PLANE IN RELATION TO EARTH. APPEARED TO BE IN A STATIONERY POSITION. AIRCRAFT WAS FLYING AT 7000FT AIRSPEED 170 MPH WHEN OBJECT FIRST SIGHTED OBJECT APPEARED TO BE ABOVE 30000FT. AIRCRAFT CLIMBED TO 11000FT AND MADE 30 DEGREE TURN IN EFFORT TO OBTAIN BETTER VIEW OF OBJECT. OBJECT DID
