San Antonio ARTCC received a report from Laughlin AFB Control Tower of an aircraft
crash 60NM north of Del Rio, Texas, about the time of the UFO sighting. County
Sheriff's Department forwarded this report of aircraft crash to the ARTCC. However
no further report or confirming report was received. Midland, Texas, ARTCC had no
report of an aircraft crash at that time.


