




1. The photograph which you recently submitted for interpretation and analysis has been examined. The photograph was printed to an extreme contrast (all black or white with little gray tone), precluding a definitive photo-analysis.
2. The light-colored spot in the sky portion of the photograph does appear to be an image rather than a scratch or some other inadvertent mark on the negative.
3. If a detailed analysis is desired, it is recommended that the original negative be obtained.

1. A photograph taken of the Capitol by a Mr. [REDACTED] of Portugal, during his visit to Washington, D. C. in February 1959, was forwarded to the ATIC for analysis. In addition to the Capitol the photograph contains an image of an unidentified object over the Capitol area.
2. The ATIC photograph interpreters determined that the image of the object is probably real. However, the original negative is needed to complete a full analysis. It is suggested that a letter be written to Mr. [REDACTED] requesting the negatives.
3. Mr. [REDACTED] mistakenly identified the Capitol as the Pentagon in his letter which accompanied the photograph.
4. Mr. [REDACTED] did not request return of the photograph. It has therefore been retained for the ATIC file.

1. The attached negative was forwarded to the ATIC by Mr. ██████████ of Portugal. Mr. ██████████ took this picture during a visit to the United States in February 1959.
2. The subject took the picture at approximately 2100 on 4 February 1959. Mr. ██████████ states that the light which shows to the left and above the capitol was not in evidence when the picture was taken.
3. The witness did not offer any of the conditions under which this photograph was made. However, it is obvious that the subject was located on the mall, fairly close to half way between the capitol and the Washington monument.
4. Analysis and/or an explanation of the light to the left and above the capitol is requested.


