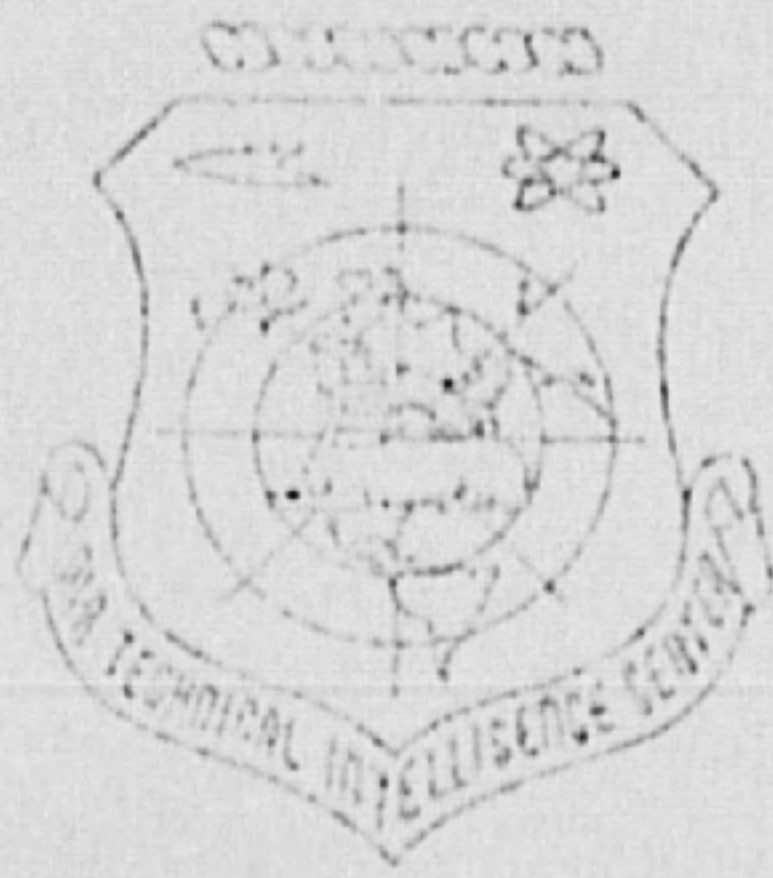

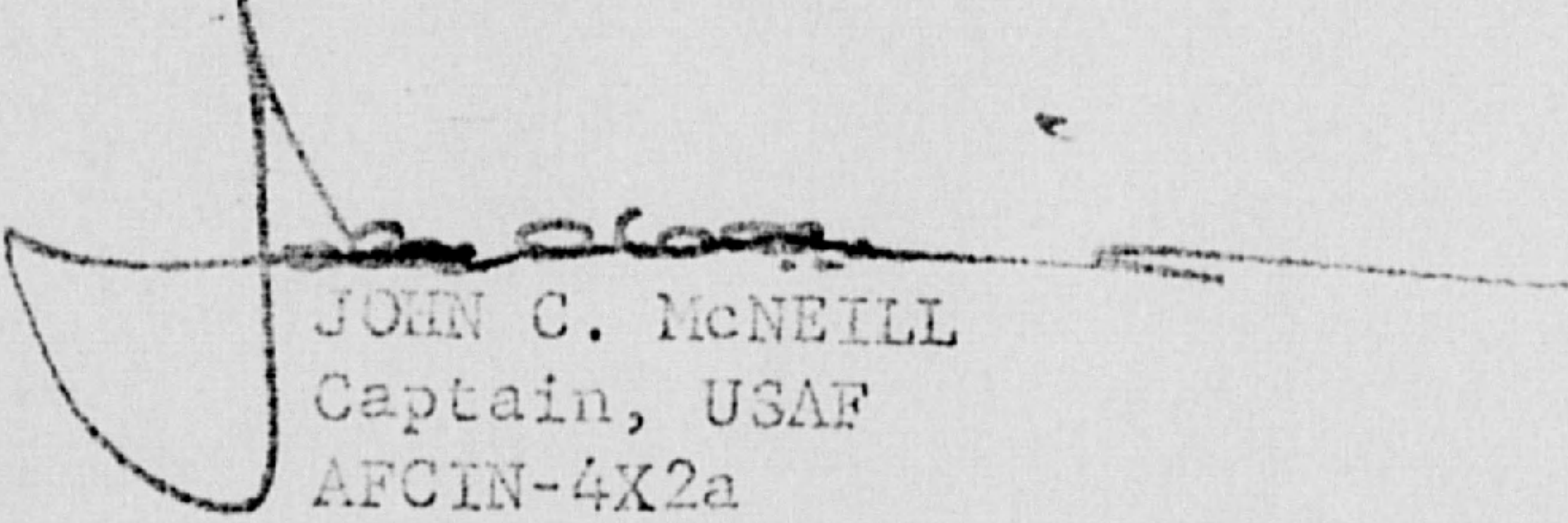

Following is an extract from ATIC Duty Officer CWO A B Tenold's report dtd 24-25 June 59 for your information.

2300 - Rec'd call fm Shoemaker, RADCON who reported the following info for our UFO Office - "Two airplanes had noticed balls of fire; one plane was at 1800 ft NE of Clinton County Homer Radio and the other plane was about 8 miles west of Washington Courthouse at approx 2300 ft and that plane reported the speed of the object at about 600 miles per hour". This info was reported approx 2300 hrs.
