OFFICER, HQ, NEW YORK ADS, MCGUIRE AFB, NJ. A CHECK OF AIR FORCE BASES IN THE AREA OF THE SIGHTING INDICATED THAT NO WEATHER BALOONS HAD BEEN RELEASED IN THE AREA AND TIME UNDER QUESTION. HOWEVER, SINCE THE WINDS WERE FROM 290 TO 310 DEGREES, IT IS POSSIBLE THAT A BALOON FROM SOME OTHER BASE TO THE WEST OF THE SITE LOCATION MAY HAVE BEEN THE CAUSE.

2. What was the approximate elevation of the object above the horizon in degrees when last sighted? It seemed to go up higher than it was, until it faded from sight.

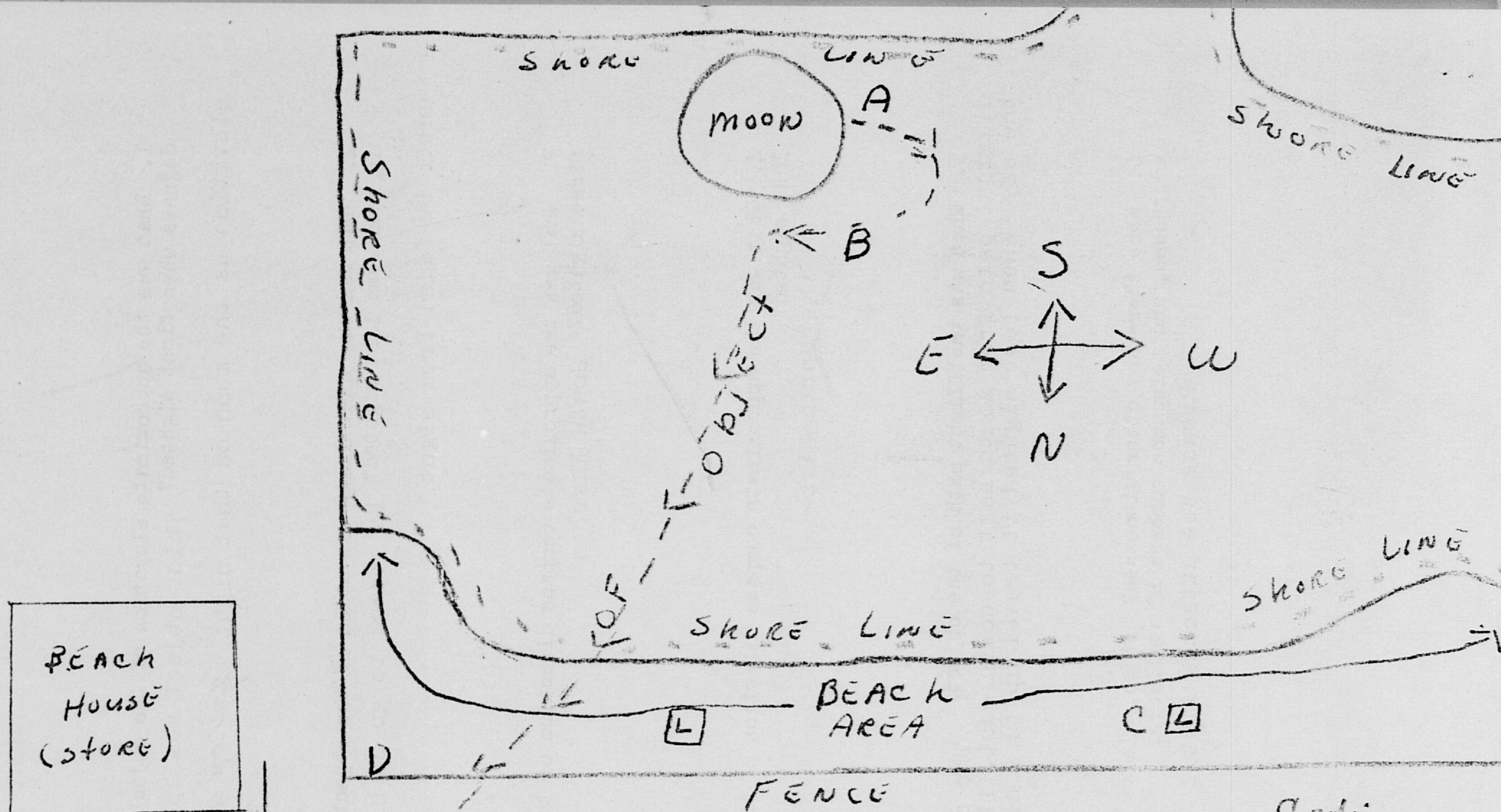
3. What was the approximate compass direction of the object from you when first sighted? South East
