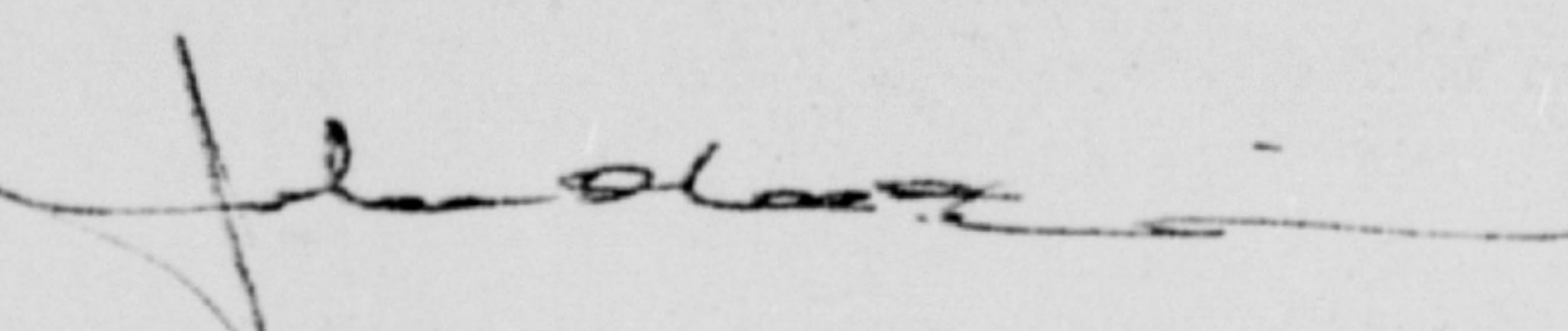

The following, extracted from Capt Saltsman's Report dated 4 Sep 60, is quoted for your information.

0830 - L/Col Workman, AMCSDO, called to say that he had a call from a M/Gen (ret) George F. Smith, now attached -- or a member of Magnavox Corp. Gen. Smith reported that a Mr. [REDACTED] also of Magnavox, had seen a large single light near Harbor Springs, Md. at approximately 1030 (p.m.??). The light then broke into many smaller lights---No other info. ATIC has received no other reports of this sighting.
