BRIGHTLY BURNING OBJECT WITH GREENISH-YELLOW FLAME FLASING INTEGMITTEMLY SIGHTED FROM VANDENBERG AFB APPROXIMATELY 23 FEB 0100ZULU. OBJECT WAS 15 TO 20 DEGREES ABOVE YOUTHEGN HORIZON TRAVELLING WEST TO EAST. SINCE SIGHTING WAS AT 1700 PST AND SUN WAS WELL ABOVE HORIZON, PHENOMENON NOT SEEN BY TWO INDEPENDENT OBSERVERS; ONE A WEATHER FORECASTER ON BREAK, THE OTHER AN OFFICER FROM 1ST MISSILE DIVISION.
