Direction and elevation reported for objt and that of star are same at time of sighting. Time reported for disappearance is coincident with setting time for star as viewed fm location of witness. Sirius is brightest star (apparent) in our heavens and was misidentified by this witness. Misidentification was probably helped along by distortions due to atmospheric refraction and an active imagination.
