

Sirs: Flying Object (3) - Saturday
Oct. 20, 1962, approx. 11:30 pm.
at Pacific Grove, Calif.

Many days overdue in this report which
at a second thought I must send off
(Time flies!) ; (4 days later reported at Police Station);

Thing & Time & Place: In my bedroom to re-
lax; in good health;
fully clothed; my mind a complete blank &
watching nothing; with light out I sat on my
bed which is approx. 6 ft. from the window
(usually retire between midnight & one a.m.);

- On Oct. 20, 1962, Saturday, 11:30 ± p.m., I saw;
- I was attracted by a ball of light, dark
creamy, approx. 7 inches (seven) in
diameter at the left of the corner of my
left eye; this beyond the window straight
ahead;
- Saw a light reflecting on an arrear-
part eight to ten inches or less ~~about~~
color could have been white transparent.
I reduce this particular seeing
to: light radiating from a point only
dim that part of emergence only
the visible part would be the opposite
surface on which the glow is received.

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- The glow was then in full open-air; or glassed-in-area; or did I see it through the outer wall — light does penetrate all things, one could see that sometimes; (Color seeing at ^{this} close range could have been transparent white);
- The thing proceeding to the outer sea area from Monterey area (I connect to; seeing first at left then fully ahead.) did not have presence of mind to check it through an open window;
- ~~AD~~ - gave off no noise whatsoever;
- First thought - shooting star? With exceptions such does not function horizontally;
- Though I have no ground for my judgement, none whatsoever (for I saw not its shade) I thought it went whizzed-past my window. Best words only get in this way; but might add I didn't think it went this way: →, and looking like  I keep thinking it went like an arrow & somehow think of its shade as  (seen looks like an arrow, ^{or capsule} didn't if - But don't go by my DIAGRAM, I didn't see it);
- my window of the second story, lowest frame begins about level low cottaged out ^{the window} begins their roofs; went slightly above the roof ... low;

freely by my own words, coming up with
the very first explanation of the following moments
to it.
