SPEED BELIEVED TO BE IN EXCESS OF 2000 MPH. ALTITUDE ESTIMATED AT MORE  
THAN 20,000 FEET.

2. WEATHER AT TIME OF SIGHTING: SKY AND CEILING 4000 FT  
SCATTERED, VISIBILITY 20 MIS PLUS, WIND NNE AT 4 KTS. SKY TO EAST  
OF STATION APPROX 2 TENTHS COVERED, REMAINING SKY CLEAR. TOTAL  
DARKNESS AT TIME OF SIGHTING.
