J. FAA C-54 CALL SIGN N-85 OVER HARMON VOR AT 25/0115Z AT
4,000 FT. WEATHER BALLON RELEASED AT SAME TIME. GENERAL
MOVEMENT 310-130 DEGREES MOVING UP 1,00 FT PER MINUTE.

K. ASSISTANT DEPUTY COMMANDER FOR OPERATION.

L. PRELIMINARY ANALYSIS.

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(A) INDICATIONS ARE THAT THE OBJECT SIGHTED WASNOT THE
FAA C-54 OR THE RADIO SONDE WEATHER BALLON KNOWN TO BE IN THE
AREA OF ERNEST HARMON AIR FORCE BASE, NEWFOUNDLAND, AT THE
APPROXIMATE TIME OF THE SIGHTING. REASON FOR THIS CONCLUSION IS
THAT THE OBSERVER REPORTED THAT THE OBJECT PASSED DIRECTLY OVER
HIS RESIDENCE. NEITHER THE C-54 NOR THE WEATHER BALLON PASSED
OVER THE OBSERVER'S POSITION.

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(B) CHECKS WITH RAPCON INDICATE NO KNOWN HIGH ALTITUDE
TRAFFIC. IN ADDITION, DESCRIPTION OF THE OBJECT INDICATES AIR-
CRAFT NOT SOURCE OF SIGHTING.

(C) CHECKS WITH 640TH AC & W SQUADRON GIVES NEGATIVE
INDICATION THAT GEMINI OR OTHER KNOWN SATELLITES ARE IN-
VOLVED.

2. POSSIBLE CAUSE. IN VIEW OF THE KNOWN DATA IT IS
ASSUMED THAT THE SOURCE OF THE SIGHTING IS:

(A) UNKNOWN ORBITAL OBJECT OR

(B) AN OPTICAL ILLUSION OR OTHER PHENOMENA.

3. NOTE: OBSERVER REPORTED THAT HE MADE A SIMILAR
SIGHTING 48 HOURS BEFORE THE SIGHTING REPORTED HEREIN.

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INFORMALLY, IT IS UNDERSTOOD THAT OTHER LOCAL PERSONS
VIEWED SIMILAR OBJECTS ON 22 AND 23 AUG 65. THEY BELIVED
IT TO BE GEMINI 5.

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
