K. MAJ JOHN C. MC KIBBEN ASST. OPERATIONS OFFICER. THE OBSERVER STATED THAT THE OBJECT WAS VERY BRIGHT, WHEN COMPARED TO THE BRIGHTNESS OF STARS, AND LARGER THAN STARS. IN THE REPORTING OFFICERS OPINION THIS SOUNDS VERY MUCH LIKE THE DESCRIPTION OF A WEATHER BALLOON. I PERSONNALLY SAW A WEATHER BALLOON AT DUSK, ABOUT SIX MONTHS AGO IN PANAMA, AND THIS DESCRIPTION IS MUCH THE SAME AS I WOULD HAVE GIVEN, HAD I NOT KNOWN WHAT I WAS LOOKING AT. IN THIS REPORT IT WAS JUST BEFORE DAWN AND WHEN I SAW THE WX BALLOON IT WAS AT DUSK. IN BOTH CASES THE LIGHT RAYS OF THE SUN WERE HIGH IN THE SKY EVEN THOUGH IT WAS DARK OR NEARLY DARK ON THE GROUND
