



I was in back yard of house, waiting for my older son, when I noticed VFO coming up Southern horizon. Clear night, many aircraft around, since traffic pattern to National Airport was to the South that night. The VFO advanced very swiftly; it was higher, by far, than local aircraft. There were no blinking navigation lights & no flasher lights on it. Since it would pause momentarily at times, & zig zag at times, I doubt, seriously, if it were a satellite; their hovering ability is small. Since the color & size did not change as it approached or receded, doubt if the "jet exhaust" explanation will work; I have very seldom been able to fly a jet backwards. And, since there is no real swamp nearby, doubt seriously if it were swamp gas.

(Pardon — maybe — the sarcasm, but I've been kicked around on this subject before, even when borne out by other crew members and magnetic aircraft instrument deviations). Since I am now retired, I do not have to subordinate intellect to the party line).

As VFO approached within, I ran into our house, to tell my

family - they came out, & all saw the UFO, too. My older son called one of his friends, who, with his sister, came out. I left at approximately 2125, with my older son. The 1st UFO was gone, but the second one was still there (relatively attached). I returned at approximately 2205; meanwhile, 3 more UFO's were seen. At 2215 my younger son & I saw the extraordinary "metcon" (3rd report, attached).

As VFO #1 was almost to horizon to north (trees, houses, etc.), there was an extremely bright & extremely short burst of light, to the right, at 45°. From this, or so it looked, came the 2nd UFO.

My younger son raced in the house & got his binoculars, adjusted them, & yelled with excitement: "It's a Flying Saucer. I see the disk." he, ~~is~~ at this time, was rather naive on the subject. I took the glasses, & I, too, saw the disk (Note: my eyes are good). My younger son drew a quick sketch of what he saw; we still have it, I think.

I am reporting what I saw. If other reports are desired, the names of the other witnesses are listed. There are additional people, non-related, who, I ~~think~~ found out later, saw VFO #1 at the same time, doing the same things.






As UFO #1 was almost on horizon, still travelling very fast, there was an instantaneous & extremely bright flash, approx. 45° up ^{and} to the right. Our attention was attracted to it, naturally. From the location of the flash came UFO #2, travelling very fast. It slowed, then slowed further, & finally hovered over the exact spot on the Northern horizon where UFO #1 had just disappeared. In size, it was about $\frac{1}{2}$ that of UFO #1; it seemed further away. The same soft white color was not as intense, either, as UFO #1. We watched it, then at 2125 I left with my older son, to take him to a dance; UFO #2 was still hovering. Its subsequent actions, to me hearsay, can be described, if desired by the listed witnesses on the report on UFO #1.

The flash was something I had never seen before. It had no color, but that doesn't really describe it. An analogue could be a flash bulb (duration), or an instantaneous magnesium flare (of which I've never heard) for intensity. Actually, intuition says it came from UFO #2. No strobe light, etc., as there was but this one flash. A weapon?

- 2) If, as a ~~fighter~~ pilot, I didn't do my job correctly (basic ingredients: identifying objects in the sky, estimating speeds, etc) I did not survive. In other words, the motivation was higher. I survived!






Upon return to my house, I found my younger son, Hilary, plus a friend, still outside watching the sky. I went in the house momentarily, & joined him outside, at 2205. We looked for more UFO's, while he told me of the 3 others (including a big one) he & the others had seen while I was gone. I pointed out to him, again, the way to recognize aircraft (blinking lights, patterns, speed, etc), the differences between the twinkling of the stars & the steady glow of the planets.

At 2215, we were looking North, down Montgomery Ave, in the same area where most of the previous activity had taken place. At this time, a "meteor" flamed into view, plunged earthward, & burned before it reached the horizon. Having many hours of night flying, I have seen hundreds of meteors. However, I have never seen one so large. In addition, I, personally, have never seen one shedding bits & pieces as it flamed earthward; these bits & pieces burned separately. I have seen aircraft shed, but not bolts. This "meteor"; an irregular ball of colored flame, shed as it fell; it, & all pieces, burned prior to reaching the horizon.



Important Note:

I am more than glad to cooperate in the gathering of UFO information. On active duty, I had no choice; I do now. I am also perfectly willing to have questions asked of my family, if any are desired — provided, some smart a-huck-know-it-all

doesn't condone. For example, another fighter pilot, friend of mine, after making a report in Japan upon an UFO sighting, seen by other pilots, too, was asked (1) how much he drank, (2) did he take dope (3) was there any insanity in his family, and (4) even, so help me, how much he abused himself. Any garbage like that, & this now-plainly critical will trash the so-called "investigation" out the house, bodily; I will not allow my family to be treated in such a fashion.

I do not demand even an open (and, therefore, "scientific" in the real sense of the word) mind, but I do demand the ordinary decencies & courtesies from any AF investigator. These standards were observed by the other organizational, & private, investigators who have already interviewed us.

Dear Miss Hunt:

Finally, enclosed are the three reports on the UFOs I saw on 19 March 1966. There have been other pressing items since I talked with you on the telephone; besides, I've never heard of the AF doing much with such reports, except rat-holing them, anyway. However, as a patriotic American, and a retired AF officer, I'm glad to fill in the reports, and send them in. Maybe, some day, God and the Administration willing, there will be an open and scientific investigation of this phenomena.

I think that you will be interested in reading these reports, especially since you, too, saw one of those "flashes" in the sky. And, if you ever do receive any sort of a sensible answer from Wright-Pat, and can let me know, I'd certainly appreciate it. If the answer is "swamp gas", however, you can forget it, for ~~yourself~~ yourself as well as for me.

There is still much information to be picked up from the other witnesses; I did NOT fill in any of the reports ~~from~~ them, as that is hardly the scientific method. If you, and/or Wright-Pat wants these additional reports, they can get them. However, as I noted in the reports themselves, there had better be no investigators bothering my family. While I welcome honest investigations both of my sightings, and of ~~my~~ family's, any treatment such as I've seen meted out to ~~active~~ ^{some} AF personnel who had the conviction to report what they had seen, will meet with resistance.
