Sighting of 28 March 1966

Four Groups - 1 Group North of Yellow Springs, 1 Group North of Runway, 39.51 Lat, 84.41 Long, & 1 Group NW of Sulpher Grove 1 Group SSE and of Base, 3 miles north of Oldtown. Second group saw object, couldn't estimate speed, looked like small star, like pea, or $\frac{1}{4}$ inch, first at 5 deg ~~az~~, elev 81 ^{az} ~~deg~~; moved, jumped up and then dropped down, 5 ^{elev} ~~deg~~ az to 90 deg ~~az~~, North - East, 90 az, 4.5 elev, had sexton compasses. At 0500 lost sight and contacted other group. It looked reddish color, couldn't identify as a/c, just a point of light, couldn't estimate speed, 5 deg - 90 deg, 15 minutes. Reddish tinge, to bluish white. Did see Venus 7.526 elev, 119 deg az, Paul Managhan, 119 Lawnview Avenue, Dayton, Ohio 45409 said the 10 foot drop could have been an illusion.
