Obj stayed suspended in air about 50 seconds, obj disappeared from sight into a cumulus cloud. Obj took two seconds to make the climb.

7. COURSE Northeast	There were aircraft in the area at the time departing from Baldwin County airport and traveling north, the same direction that witness saw object travel. It is possible that observer saw one and/or both of these aircraft with sunlight reflecting on it. However, carried as insufficient data for evaluation, since observer did not return 164.

GEORGIA: A. DESCRIPTION OF THE OBJECT: (1) SAUCER SHAPE-

SLIGHTLY MORE OVAL ON TOP THAN BOTTOM SIDE - LOOKED LIKE TOP OF

A GARBAGE CAN WITHOUT THE HANDLE; (2) DIME; (3) ALUMINUM/

SILVERY - DID NOT GLOW AND/OR CHANGE COLOR EXCEPT FOR SUNS

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REFLECTION ON THE METAL: (4) ONE; (5) N/A; (6) NONE; (7) NONE.

(8) NO SOUND; (9) NONE. B. DESCRIPTION OF COURSE OF OBJECT:

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(1) WHILE DRIVING HIS AUTOMOBILE, HE TOPPED A SMALL HILL AND LOOKED TO HIS RIGHT FOR CHILDREN AND OBSERVED OBJECT SUSPENDED IN THE SKY. HE PARKED HIS CAR AND OBSERVED OBJECT FROM OUTSIDE HIS CAR; (2) OBJECT WAS ABOUT 35 DEGREES ABOVE THE HORIZON AND ZERO DEGREES AZIMUTH; (3) OBJECT WAS ABOUT 30 DEGREES AVE THE HORIZON AND APPROXIMATELY FIVE DEGREES AZIMUTH; (4) OBJECT STAYED SUSPENDED IN AIR ABOUT 50 SECONDS; OBJECT THEN MOVED DIRECTLY AWAY AT ABOUT THE SAME ALTITUDE DECREASING FROM THE SIZE OF A DIME TO THE SIZE OF A BB SHOT; OBJECT THEN SHOT STRAIGHT UP 2 1/2 TO 3 INCHES (ESTIMATED THOUSAND FEET) AND THEN MOVED SLIGHTLY NORTHEAST AT SAME ALTITUDE AS IT STOPPED ITS CLIMB UNTIL IT DISAPPEARED FROM SIGHT INTO A CUMULUS CLOUD. OBJECT TOOK ABOUT TWO SECONDS TO MAKE THE CLIMB; (5) MOVED NORTHEAST AND DISAPPEARED IN CUMULUS CLOUD; (6) EIGHT MINUTES. C. MANNER OF OBSERVATION: (1) GROUND-VISUAL; (2) NONE USED; (3) N/A. D. 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ENFORCEMENT DIVISION, ROBINS AIR FORCE BASE GEORGIA. COMMENTS:

THE TWO AIRCRAFTS DEPARTING FROM BLADWIN COUNTY AIRPORT TRAVELED DUE NORTH, THE SAME DIRECTION WHERE OBSERVER CLAIMED TO HAVE SEEN THE UFO. OBSERVER POSSIBLY SAW ONE AND/OR BOTH OF THESE

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AIRCRAFTS AND OBSERVED SUNLIGHT REFLECTING ON IT. HE DID NOT KEEP THE OBJECT UNDER CONSTANT SURVEILLANCE AS HE WAS ATTEMPTING TO FIND SOMEONE ELSE TO SHOW THE OBJECT TO. HOWEVER, OBSERVER ASSERTED THAT HE CLEARLY SAW THE OUTLINE OF THE OBJECT AND IT WAS SAUCER SHAPE. OBSERVER WAS POSITIVE OBJECT OBSERVED WAS NOT AN AIRCRAFT AND/OR BALLOON. THE PERFORMANCE OF THIS OBJECT WAS UNLIKE ANY KNOWN AIRCRAFT. POLICE CHECK REVEALED NO RECORD CONCERNING OBSERVER. NO OTHER REPORTS OF UFO MADE TO POLICE, MILLEDGEVILLE, GEORGIA, ON 3 MAY 1966.
