The object blinked until it came to a standstill, then the light stayed on, until beyond stars, or out of sight. The light was equal to three night lights. The object looked like an enormous revolving or blinking white shining star, with some sort of a tail. The observers have reported numerous sightings since June 1966. In all cases it appears that mere lights in the sky were witnessed. On this particular observation it appears that an aircraft was observed. The description is consistent with that of an aircraft observation.

I can positively say that this object was a craft of some kind.

Since this sighting, we, and some relatives, have noticed a specific path of another U.F.O traveling out of the ~~North~~^{West} to the SE. We have seen this happen between the hours of 6:45pm. to 8:30pm. It has the characteristics as follows:

It a bright white light traveling about 40 mph. and around 400 feet over the Miss. Lines. It travels past a tall cable T.V. tower, then it changes to a red light. Then after seeing it for awhile, it turns the light off. This was proven by me calling my Mom and Dad who lives $\frac{3}{4}$ mi. below us. They run out to see it do these things. We have seen 4 travel on the same path, and do the same things. (one) (SEE DIAGRAM ENCLOSED)
