Dear Sirs:

Last Wednesday the 21 of March I stepped outside before going to bed to get some fresh air. The time was 9 P.M. My attention was suddenly captured by a pair of parallel bright steady lights gliding silently across the sky above me. Suddenly the 2 lights stopped at a point in the sky where 2 more pair were "waiting." There they were 3 pair of lights; each pair parallel to the other, hovering motionless in the air. There was little if any wind and I heard no motor or other machinical noise of any kind. It appears to me that they (the lights) were

no jets, or planes. I do a great deal of star gazing and I have never seen anything like it in my life. They hung motionless in air for about 20 minutes, each above the other, then they slowly, without sound or fuel stream, ~~they~~ began to fly on to the west. I witnessed this sighting 6 miles from Campbellsville, Kentucky. It is located in the South, Central portion of the state.

I would appreciate it very much if you would write me and give your conclusion as to what ~~it~~ might have been.



at this time I would like to give in as few words as possible a summary of my sighting, which was witnessed also by mother and my sister. Before I start however, I would like to say that unfortunately I did not reserve a copy of the letter that I sent to Wash. D. C.; therefore I have no record of the date on which I saw this (object) object. But the time, date, information you may need is given in my letter to the U. S. A. F., Wash. D. C., which I sent after I saw the objects.

I, for one, do a great deal of stargazing. I was doing just this that night when I saw these objects. When I looked up at the center of the sky I spotted 2 fast moving lights. They were going as fast as a jet and yet as I listened, I heard no motor sound. Usually when I see a jet I notice 3 distinct things: ① there is a red or green or both lights ② there is a sound even though it takes several seconds to hear it ③ they are gone in a matter of seconds. But these objects did not behave as jets, as they (the 2) came swiftly across the sky they ^{came} ~~were~~ 4 other lights. When the two objects ^(lights) ~~were~~ reached the 4 other lights the two objects changed position as one light past over above and to the other side of its parallel companion. When the 2 objects reached the other 4 light

they immediately stopped. One second they were going very fast and the next minute they were standing still, and they were silent still. Now all were in "standing" in air as indicated in the illustration. They remained suspended or hovering in air, appearing not to move at all. It was at this time that I summoned my mother and sister out to see them too. My dad, an unbeliever of 21. F. O.'s did not care to see them. The objects stayed still in the air for at least one minute. Then they broke their formation and together started on west. This time going very slowly. It took them two or three minutes to disappear over the horizon. During this time of 4 or 5 minutes I had (& my mother & sister) heard no sound nor seen blinking lights. I must state this before closing that I do not necessarily believe they were flying saucers. But I do believe that they were not jets, planes, or helicopters. In short I just don't know what they were. So please don't take me as a phenatic for I repeat I do not know what they were.
