

I am writing this letter to inform you of a sighting that I and 13 other people saw while in school yesterday. I am a teacher at the above school and twelve of the people listed on the attached sheet are in my class with the remaining one in a class on the floor below mine.

I was in Room 218 of Euclid Senior High School

at the time of the sighting. This room is in the main part of the building that faces East 222nd Street and is situated parallel (running North and South) to East 222nd Street.

The date of the sighting was May 4, 1967 at 12:13 P.M. (Daylight Savings Time) The object appeared from the North and was traveling to the South - South-West.

It was approximately 70 feet from the ground and appeared at a distance of about 250 yards from the window in my classroom.

We viewed the object for a total time of about 23 seconds. We then proceeded to leave the room and go outside and when we reached the out-of-doors, the object had left our scope of vision.

I did not hear any sound or see any flashing lights on the object. It was the shape of one-half a surf-board or the shape of a dill pickle. It was approximately the size of a full moon in width at the largest end and tapered to approximately one-half the depth of the moon. It was twice the length of a full moon in its length. It did not leave any trail and it did not explode. It was white in color and had red stripes. Enclosed is a hand drawing of the object. It was misty and illuminous.


The condition of the sky was clear and a normal mid-day blue. There was no rain and it was a most clear day.



1. Our office is in receipt of an observation of an unidentified flying object report for 4 May 1967 at 1213 EDT from the Euclid, Ohio area. The object was the shape of half a surfboard or the shape of a pickle. It was approximately the size of a full moon in width at the largest end and tapered to approximately one-half the depth of the moon. It was white in color and had red stripes. The object was heading toward the southwest when last seen, which should have placed it over or in the vicinity of the airport. Inclosed is a copy of a drawing of the object.
2. Request information on any type of aircraft under your jurisdiction which could have accounted for the sightings. Possibly some type of conventional craft with red markings could have been responsible for the sighting.

Dear Colonel Manatt:

I have no knowledge of any unusual aircraft mentioned in your letter dated May 24, 1967 regarding a UFO observation at 1214 EDT May 4, 1967 in the vicinity of Euclid, Ohio.

Our records indicated that the only aircraft under our control in the vicinity of Euclid, Ohio during the reported sighting was American Airlines Flight #707, a Lockheed Electra. American's aircraft have red/orange, white and silver marking. Flight #707 arrived at Mentor intersection at 1206 EDT via Victor Airway 14 and was radar vectored to Stadium Radiobeacon, arriving Stadium at 1210 EDT.
