SUBJECT: UFO Observation, 19 March 1968

Lt Marano spoke with the Deputy Sheriff at Bealsville, Ohio with regards to the sighting of 19 March 1968. Lt Marano asked if he had received any additional data on the case. A man by the name of [REDACTED] from Northern West Virginia of APRO took samples of the coat and was sending it to their scientists. They sent the remainder of the coat with the Fire Marshall to London State Farm for tests.

[REDACTED] called back and wanted some more samples however, they couldn't comply with his request since the Fire Marshall took all the remaining samples.

Subj: UFO Report, 19 March 1968

At 0745, 21 March 1968, Major Hector Quintanilla, Jr spoke with the Monroe County Sheriff at Beallsville, Ohio (614, 472-1612) with regards to the UFO observation of Wells and subsequent burns. The Sheriff said that one of their officers had went over there and the Civil Defense Director went over with geiger counters and couldn't find anything at all. The Sheriff said "We were thinking that the boy had burned his jacket and just finished burning it." The Sheriff said that in this town the kids are fanatics about UFOs. About 50% believe the story and about 50% don't. The Sheriff said they have what's left of the jacket. The Sheriff did not speak with Dr. Philips, however, he thought that the newspapers had talked to him and "I don't think he would have released the boy if he thought there was anything to it." The boy said the object hovered over him and an arm dropped out of it. The Sheriff said there was a rumor going around school that he did burn his jacket smoking. Underneath the jacket there was a sweatshirt that only had very few burns on it. The jacket doesn't smell from gas or anything like that. The Sheriff said "I have been Sheriff since 1949 and I bet if I had him alone for ten minutes I could find out what's going on." "I think it will be out; I've got some young kids feeling him out." The Sheriff said it is so bad there that some of the people are thinking about moving out of the area. It's just the rural area and they are always on the ball with UFOs. They make fun and laugh about it all the time but they still believe in it. The Sheriff informed Major Quintanilla that they would be having a break on the case, probably in a day or so and would call him then, also asked Major Quintanilla if he got anything new, would he please call them.



